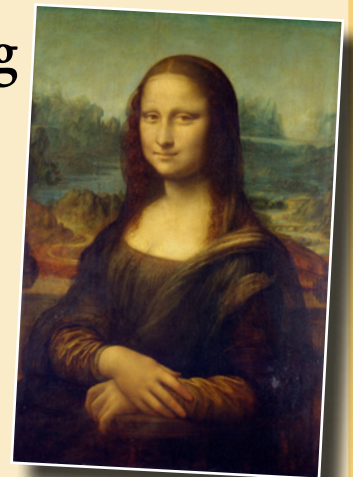

Unsurprisingly, the most visited painting in the world is also the most famous portrait ever painted – the Mona Lisa. Created by Italian artist Leonardo da Vinci at the start of the 16th century, it's valued at well over \$660 million. The painting has been on display in the Louvre on and off since 1797. It has been described as "the best known, the most visited, the most written about, the most sung about, (and) the most parodied work of art in the world"

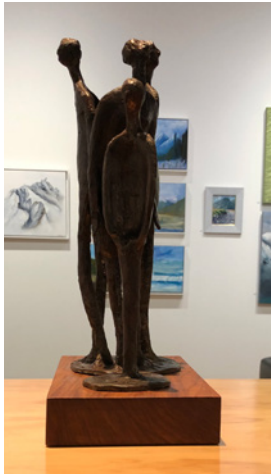

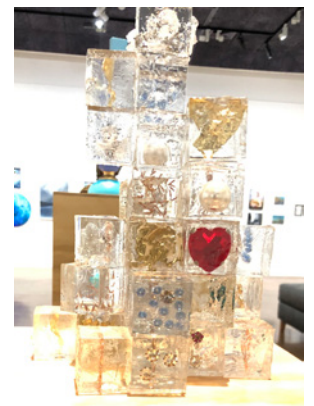
